Print Circuit Report

Today the sun is shining. This is a rare occurrence in Saskatchewan this fall and I am brimming with energy!

The Print Circuits all went out in September and, although circumstances have slowed one down, all seems to be going well. The circuits each have six members, but if someone else wishes to give them a try, they can work well with seven photographers.

Given that so much of our photographic sharing is done on-line now, the print circuits may seem like an anachronism, but the interest has remained steady.

One of the pluses in the Circuit is that there are very few rules! Maximum size of the image is dictated by the size of the page protector. Subject matter is open, although images celebrating cruelty or are pornographic are not acceptable. That being said, I have never had to remove an image for these reasons. The technique used to create the image is wide open, but of course, must be the work of the maker. The members are encouraged to evaluate the images in a helpful manner, even if particular ones have no personal impact.

One of the positives of the circuit is that you can be confident that the photo remains the same for each member. Different monitor size and colour calibration may subtly change some parameters in the same way the old slide projectors used to vary in quality, although improvements in computer technology is fixing many of these concerns.

If anyone, especially in the newer clubs, wishes to join a circuit, please contact me at maureen.sinclair@sasktel.net and I will give you more details. The next time to join a circuit will be January 2017.

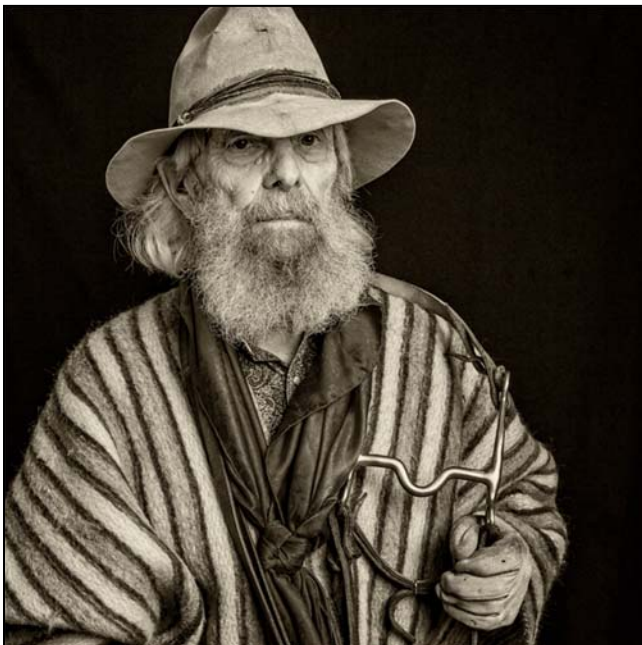

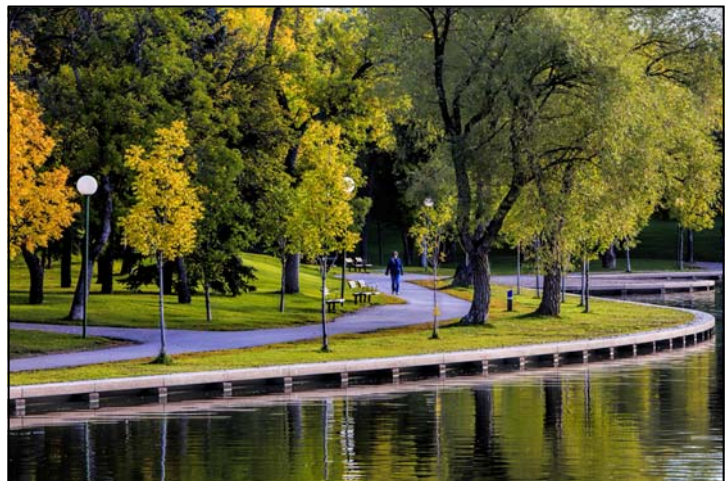

PRPA Annual General Meeting

Report by Stan Hingston from Minutes by Shirley J. Gerlock
Heritage Inn, Saskatoon, June 10, 2016

The 2016 AGM was held on June 10 at the Heritage Inn, Saskatoon. Twenty three members attended plus special guests (and past members) Jeanette and Chris Dean.

Chairperson Ann Dies called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm and welcomed everyone present.

Treasurer Laird Wilson reported a bank balance of \$5,418 with no outstanding bills. A motion to keep the fees at \$25 for Individual Membership and \$1 per member for Club Membership was carried.

Laird reported that there were 57 Individual members and 442 Club members in 7 member clubs.

Gwen McNichol reported on her first year as Competitions Chair. Total entries this year increased from 393 to 516. Total Fall competition entries increased to 238 this year (2015) from 116 in 2014. Total Spring entries increased to 157 from 129 the previous year.

Maureen Sinclair reported there are three print circuits with a total of 17 members, only two of which are in Alberta. There is room for a few more members.

Newsletter editor Stan Hingston reported that 26 of 57 members still request a paper copy of the Prairie Focus.

Webmaster Scott Prokop reported that the website is up to date.

Archivist Shirley Gerlock has the archive files sorted by year into six plastic tubs. Duplicates of the Prairie Focus will be taken to an Outing for members; other duplications will be shredded.

As secretary, Shirley reported a quiet year with a few cards sent to members. She thanked the Executive for sending in their reports for the AGM.

Chairperson Ann Dies thanked the Rosetown club for hosting the 2016 Outing. Ann thanked the bylaws committee for their work in preparing a bylaws revision for this AGM. She also thanked the board members for their dedication to the organization and especially Gwen for taking on the Competitions position.

The proposed revised bylaws were discussed at length. They were approved and passed with the following amendments:

- Club Representatives must be an Individual Member of PRPA
- The number of directors was set at a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 15

Curtiss Lund and David Thompson Ingoe were elected as Members-at-Large, a new position that was included in the new bylaws.

The following were elected to office:

- Chair—Ann Dies
- Vice Chair—Gwen McNichol
- Treasurer—Laird Wilson
- Secretary—Shirley J Gerlock
- Past Chair—Gwen McNichol

A motion was passed approving the appointment of the following positions:

- Competitions—Gwen McNichol
- Print Circuit—Maureen Sinclair
- Membership—Laird Wilson
- Newsletter Editor—Stan Hingston
- Webmaster—Scott Prokop
- Archivist—Shirley Gerlock

Curtiss Lund adjourned the meeting at 8:30 pm.

June Board Meeting

The PRPA Board of Directors met Sunday morning, June 12, at the Heritage Inn, Saskatoon. In attendance were: Ann Dies, Gwen McNichol, Laird Wilson, Shirley J Gerlock, Maureen Sinclair, Stan Hingston, and Scott Prokop.

Shirley was asked to send a letter of appreciation to Ron Gartner of Rosetown for making the small print easels for PRPA.

Laird reported that he received a letter from Information Services Corp. (the organization that registers corporations in Saskatchewan) stating that we need a minimum of 5 officers and 5 directors and a maximum of 10 officers and 15 directors.

There was some discussion on ordering the new Club Competition plaques (Everest and Gerry Fish). Ann offered to get a graphic artist to recreate a cleaner version of the PRPA logo for use on the plaques, ribbons, etc.

Stan proposed adding \$10 to the membership fee for those opting to receive a paper copy of the Prairie Focus newsletter. Maureen strongly opposed the idea and after a brief discussion, it was dropped.

Scott said he would like some of the competitions renamed for clarification. He found them too confusing for new members. Ann said she wouldn't mind having her name taken off the fall slide show. Curtiss was to be contacted about his competition. The older competitions named for previous members (Everest, Russell, Gerry Fish and Attanyi) were to be kept for historical reasons.

Scott and Maureen will approach the Saskatoon Camera Club about hosting the 2017 Outing. A motion was passed to create a rotation of clubs in alphabetical order with new clubs given a three year grace period before hosting.

Laird offered to print 75 copies of the revised bylaws for members to replace the old ones in their handbook. He will send them to the Club Reps to distribute to their members.

The validity of the vote in amending 3.9 of the bylaws was discussed. It was suggested that 2/3 of the voting members present was required to pass. [Later we realized that this 2/3 vote applies only to the final vote on the amended bylaws, not on the amendments themselves—Ed.].

The next meeting was scheduled for November 12 in either Rosetown or Kindersley, depending on how many are coming from Alberta.

Bylaws Committee

Report by Stan Hingston

A bylaws committee of Ann Dies, Gwen McNichol, Maureen Sinclair and Stan Hingston was created at the 2015 AGM in Candle Lake to review the bylaws and prepare a draft for the AGM the following year.

The committee completely rewrote and reorganized the bylaws and presented them to the spring board meeting in Rosetown. Some changes were made and a draft approved for the AGM. At the AGM held in the Saskatoon Inn on June 10, 2016, the bylaws were approved with the following amendments:

- The clause about Club Representatives was changed so that they are required to be Individual Members of PRPA
- A clause was added limiting the number of board members to a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 15

The new bylaws, with these changes included, are now up on the website. In the very top menu go to Downloads > Documents. Paper copies are being distributed with this newsletter. Please ignore the old bylaws attached to the Handbook on the website until we can get it updated.

The Bylaws committee met again October 15 at Gwen's in Rosetown. They reviewed the new bylaws for any errors that had been missed in the first round. The committee proposed the following changes:

- Clarify the wording in 4.5 that a member may not serve in more than one executive office position at a time
- Reword 6.1 to clarify the temporary replacement clause for the coordinator positions;
- Reword 7.2 to clarify that the maximum 15 directors is in addition to the 5 officers;
- Change the name of the former "Chair" positions (Competitions, Print Circuit, and Membership plus the Newsletter Editor, Webmaster and Archivist) from "Appointed" positions to "Coordinator" position (since they are now elected rather than appointed);

These proposed changes must be approved at the November board meeting and brought to the 2017 AGM to be adopted.

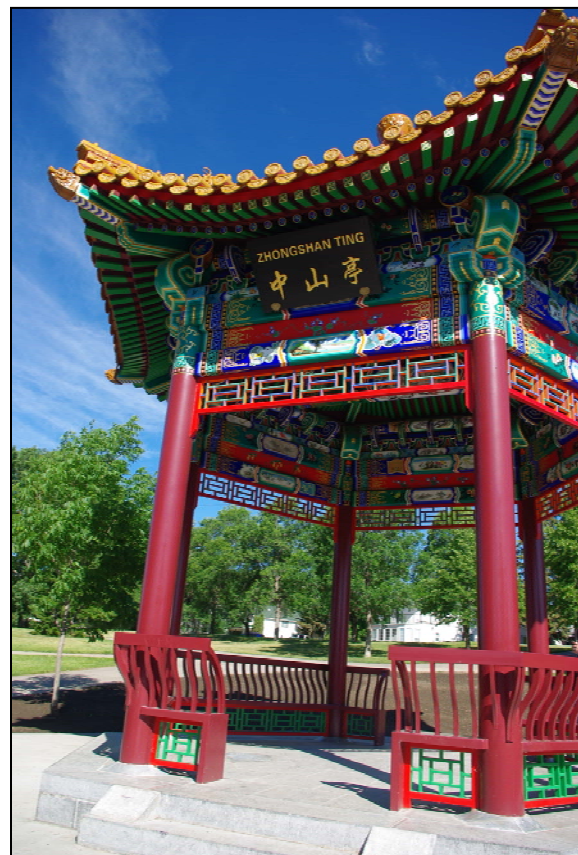


All three of the
