





# **March Board Meeting**

Report by Stan Hingston from Minutes by Shirley J Gerlock Rosetown, March 25, 2017

The PRPA Board of Directors met Saturday March 25 in Rosetown. In attendance were: Ann Dies, Shirley J Gerlock, Maureen Sinclair, Gwen McNichol, Marlene Andrew, Marilyn Nimegeers, Len Suchan, Jim Barnsley, Laird Wilson, Stan Hingston, and Scott Prokop.

Ann opened the meeting at 1:09 pm. Everyone introduced themselves around the table as it was the first meeting attended by Marlene and Marilyn from Image West Photographic Association of Swift Current.

The agenda and minutes from the November 12 board meeting were approved. Laird presented the financial report giving the bank balance as of February 28 as \$6,625.

Laird reported 70 individual members including four new members recruited with the Outing registration forms. There are ten member clubs with a total of 516 club members. After some discussion it was agreed that the membership for the four new members would include the 2017-18 year as they had joined too late to enter any of this year's competitions.

In Gwen's competitions report she reminded everyone that she needs all the judging results by May 15 to prepare for the Outing. Other reports presented were: chair by Ann, secretary by Shirley, print circuit by Maureen, newsletter by Stan, website by Scott, and archives by Shirley.

After a snack break (featuring muffins from the new Rosetown Tim Hortons!) we dealt with business arising and new business.

Stan introduced a memo from Rosetown club member Jim Turner regarding corporate registration. Jim discovered that PRPA was incorrectly registered with Information Services Corporation (ISC) following the lapse of federal corporate registration in 2014. At that time we should have been registered as a "Saskatchewan Non-profit Membership Corporation". Instead we are still registered as an "Extra-provincial Non-profit Corporation" which assumes that we are still also registered federally. Jim offered to do the work of registering PRPA "pro bono"; we would just have to pay the necessary fees.

One advantage of this registration is that only one director is required to be a resident of Saskatchewan; all other directors and officers may be from any province. We will not need to register in Alberta or any other province. A motion was passed to author-

ize Jim Turner to act on behalf of PRPA to register PRPA with ISC, and to pay any necessary registration fees.

Stan presented a list of amendments that need to be made to the 2016 bylaws. A motion was passed to approve these amendments and bring them to the AGM. See bylaws report below.

Under New Business, Jim and Len updated us on the Outing schedule. The Outing committee is pleased with the numbers that have come in so far. A revised Outing liability waiver form developed by Jim Turner was presented to the Board and a motion passed to approve it.

Stan brought forward for discussion a long list of items for revising the Handbook. Some decisions were made but many were left to the Handbook committee (Stan, Gwen & Ann). See report next page.

All currently serving officers and coordinators are willing to let their names stand for election. No new names were brought forward at this time.

No club has come forward to offer to host the 2018 Outing.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:35 pm by Laird.

# **Bylaws Committee**

In your AGM package to be mailed to you shortly, there will be a 2 page list of proposed amendments to the 2016 bylaws passed at last year's AGM.

Please review this list carefully and refer to the full bylaws as posted on the website and distributed to each member in the fall.

Most of these proposed amendments are just wording changes to reflect the fact that what we used to call "committee chair" positions (membership, competitions, print circuit, editor, webmaster and archivist) are now elected annually. Our proposed name for these is now "coordinator" positions.

One change of note is that club reps will no longer be directors or board members, but will still be encouraged to attend and participate in board meetings including the right to vote. This simplifies the board of directors which is limited to a maximum of 15 members.

#### **Handbook Committee**



At the November board meeting, Gwen McNichol and Stan Hingston volunteered to review the PRPA Handbook and prepare a revision for the Spring Board Meeting.

A list of 15 items that we wanted feedback on were discussed at the Spring board meeting with the following results:

- 1 Reference to the Member's Only section of the website is removed as we have no immediate plans to create one.
- 2 The General Competition Rules are moved to both General Rules for Print Competitions and General Rules for Digital Image Competitions. This reduces the layers of rules from three to two.
- 3 The rule about not using the same image in more than one competition does not apply to slideshows.
- 4 Post-processing allowed for all entries was discussed. Fundamental editing techniques including cropping, dust removal, noise reduction, sharpening, and adjustments to exposure, color temperature, clarity and saturation may be used. Minor elements may be removed.
- 5 The Curtiss Lund print competition will be called "Altered Reality Print Competition". The Ann Dies Slideshow competition" will be called "Single Song Slideshow Competition".
- 6 Attanyi print competition will be increased to 2 entries per member. Everest and Hand of Man will stay the same for now with 20 and 2 entries respectively.
- 7 File size for digital image entries has changed. A minimum size of 1920 pixels wide or 1200 high is recommended. Maximum file size is 10 mb for emailing, no limit for flash drive or cd. Save as jpg file. (The contact person for digital image judging clubs should have high speed internet access).
- 8 Digital image file names are now consistent in order: title\_maker\_club.jpg. Example: Pret-tySunset\_JaneDoe\_SCC.jpg. Everest entries are to be sorted into folders by category before submitting to the judging club.

- 9 The Fall and Spring Digital Image competitions will be kept as they are.
- 10 The Hand of Man definition is clarified to "landscape or object(s) that show some alteration by man; to be judged on artistic merits rather than its environmental statement."
- 11 Slideshow format for the Single Song Slideshow competition in the fall must be compatible with both PCs and Macs. The format that works best on both seems to be mp3 or mp4.
- 12 Showmanship judging rules are unchanged stating that non PRPA members are preferred while allowing one judge from the host club. The time length is changed from a maximum of 10 minutes to 8 (effective for the 2018 Outing).
- 13 Copies of all competition entry forms will be left in the handbook for reference.
- 14 The PRPA Bylaws will no longer be included in the Handbook. Both are available on the website and printed copies of both will be provided to new members on request.
- 15 A copy of the revised Handbook will be printed for all Individual Members to be distributed at the Outing or mailed. It will be posted to the website in June. New members joining in the 2017-18 season will be provided a printed copy on request.

For this session participants are required to have ND filters 10 stop is optimal, but others will work. (Some 77mm and 67mm filters will be available to use if need). You will also need a camera that has Bulb Mode, a viewfinder cover which is usually on the strap that came with the camera. Kelly uses a black tee-shirt with clips and a trigger that allow to set Bulb time. Some cameras allow you to do this right in camera.

\*Grotto Mountain: (It's a fairly difficult 15 min. hike straight up the mountain) This will give participants an aerial view of Canmore and all the surrounding mountains. It's well worth the effort.

\*Bow Valley Provincial Park Wildflowers: (Easy 2 – 4 km hike) Participants will be treated with stunning mountain flowers and views. This will be lead by a local expert on Flora and Fauna. Cliff is a wealth of knowledge which he is always eager to share.

This is our 30th year for the Hallway Gallery in a downtown mini-mall, changing the exhibits every two months. Starting in September our themes will be: Rosetown Harvest Festival, Canada 150, Lean on Me, Young & Old, Waves, and Fun with Flags.

We were invited to exhibit our photos in the hallway at Ancient Echoes in Herschel, from April to October. We chose the dark sky weekend from last August as a theme with a few other prints of the area taken by members on other occasions. Anyone attending the 2017 Dark Sky Weekend August 18-20 will have a chance to see them (see write-up in the Winter issue).

Along with the Rosetown Arts Council, the photo club co-hosted the annual adjudicated Rosetown Art & Photography Show. This year the Guest Artist is RPC & PRPA member Mary Ann Janzen. There were 85 photography entries from 14 photographers, most of them club members. See photos of the art show on page 3.

Our annual public slideshow is coming up on May 8. Seven slideshows by club members will be shown followed by cookies and tea. Topics vary from summer at the lake and camping in northern Saskatchewan, to touring Newfoundland & Labrador and a holiday in Costa Rica.

The 2016/2017 club year is nearing its end but with several outings and spontaneous gatherings to explore photography the summer is promising to be filled with great opportunities in the Moose Jaw area.

Members continue to express a keen interest in learning and are always asking for more workshops. With a new executive to be affirmed in May at the general meeting, we look forward to expanding our photographic skill horizons as the Moose Jaw Camera Club moves into its 6th year.
