



### **Competitions Chair Report**

This completes my first year as Competition Coordinator and it has been an interesting and challenging one. I commend all the previous people who held this position as it must have been an even greater challenge before computers were routinely used.

This year our entries increased by 123 from 393 to 516. The main increase was in Everest Club Competition with 6 clubs competing for a total of 120 entries. Hand of Man increased to 65 from 23. The 2015 Outing Competition had 81 digital and 40 print entries for a total of 121, down from 148 the year before. The Fall entries totaled 238 up from 116 last year and our Spring entries totalled 157, up from 129.

There were 6 entries in the Ann Dies Slideshow and 5 in the Print Portfolio. We will continue to offer these competitions and encourage everyone to try them out.

Thank you to Ann for guiding me through this year, there were a lot of texts and emails back and forth between us and I appreciate her knowledge and support. Also a huge thank you to all the club reps who promoted our competitions and for some competitions had to gather everything together to send to the judging clubs. They also had to find judges, fill out forms and return all of the info along with images to me. I appreciate their patience as I think I emailed every rep many times and mentioned that I was in panic mode a few of those times. The judges also deserve a big thank you as they are given the responsibility of judging, scoring and then adding comments to all of the entries.

The Awards Presentation showcases the many talented photographers in PRPA and adds to the enjoyment of belonging to this organization. My thank you to everyone.

- A few years ago we started requesting digital files for the print images that placed in the competitions for the awards presentation. Please make sure you keep track of where you store those files, it is sometimes hard to remember what "Hint of Spring" looks like.
- Please remember to label and size your entries according to the criteria in the Handbook which is also on the website – www.prpa.photography
- The 2016-2017 competitions with their judging clubs are listed in the Summer Prairie Focus. Club reps please contact me if you have any questions.







### Print Circuit Year End Report 2016

In times that often seem to change on a weekly basis, the print circuits keep on rolling. We have maintained a stable number of three circuits for most of my tenure as the coordinator.

Presently there are 17 members participating. My assessment of the circuit dynamics is that 7 people per circuit is feasible, which leaves four opportunities for new members to join.

Each circuit tours mostly throughout Saskatchewan as there are only two Alberta members. Circuit #2 is a Saskatchewan only group and the only all woman group. Routes and membership are continually evolving.

Generally speaking, binders are sent out in late January and in September, returning to me in December/January and May in time for display at the AGM.

Although the purpose of the circuits is contact and critiquing with and by fellow photographers, points are awarded and ribbons given. Recognition is also given in results reports in the Prairie Focus and with displaying of the top scoring images.

In a world saturated with electronic media, the print circuits seem to be meeting a need for a more hands on tangible connection, which I will gladly continue to facilitate.

In addition to this, one of our members put on a Lightroom series throughout the year, covering everything from file management to editing with this powerful program. Nicki Chang-Powless' efforts were greatly appreciated by all those who were able to attend these informative seminars.

The weekend includes: two sunsets and two sunrises; two dark (hopefully clear) nights for astrophotography; a daytime guided tour of the

# **Spring Board Meeting**

April 16, 2016, Rosetown SK

Following lunch at the Highway Host restaurant, 12 members of PRPA and one guest met at the Rose Room of the Rosetown Civic Centre for the Spring board meeting: Gwen McNichol, Brenda Winny, Stan Hingston & Jim Turner from Rosetown; Ann Dies, Michelle Vold from Gleneath; Anna Hergert and Rob Harden from Moose Jaw, Maureen Sinclair and Scott Prokop from Saskatoon, and Shirley Gerlock and Laird Wilson from Regina. Myrna Forge of the Moose Jaw Camera Club attended as a guest.

PRPA Chairperson Ann opened the meeting at 1:25.

Brenda updated us on the 2016 Outing.

Laird presented the financial report. Savings and checking account balances total \$6,649. PRPA has 57 Individual Members and 442 Club Members from seven Member Clubs: Foothills (133), Gleneath (7), Group of Ten (21), Moose Jaw (47), Saskatoon (128), Regina (91) and Rosetown (15).

Maureen reported that there is room for another member in each of the three print circuits.

Stan distributed the Spring Prairie Focus.

Gwen reported on her first year as Competitions chair and thanked Ann (the previous Competitions chair) for her ongoing support.
