What caused me to reduce the number of print competitions I entered this year is the stacks of prints in my house of previous years' entries.

# Print Circuit Report

Traveling circuits have been part of PRPA for decades. At first it was only slides with, I believe, five circuits at one time. When print circuits were introduced there was only one, which ran pretty much the same as they do now.

Participants enter two prints (usually 8x10 but can be smaller) and critique the prints from their fellow members. It seems that six is an optimum number for each circuit allowing the binders to travel twice each calendar year.

I have been Print Circuit coordinator since 2008 when I accepted the duties for both print and slide circuits. 2012-13 was the last year the slide circuit ran as interest dropped considerably with the improvement in digital photography.

Currently there are three print circuits with six members in each. Last year we had four, not all full, and, with a few retirements, two circuits were folded into one.





The three circuits are now full and I would need a minimum of four people to run a fourth one again. If you are interested, I could fit in one more person and it is always good to have names on a waiting list.

I have one circuit back and the other two are on their way.

# **The De-Mystifying Filter** by Keith Putt #8 – Sharpening

In the film days, pretty much the only way to control sharpness was lens selection. With digital, lens choice is still a factor – the more you spend, the better it should be. However, editing software has no real limit to how much you can sharpen. This issue of the De-Mystifying filter attempts to give some insight into when and how much to sharpen.

First of all, there is an ever increasing obsession with sharpness and sharpening. Human nature seems to be - if some is enough, more is better. Be careful. Excessive software sharpening is harsh, causes halos and accentuates noise. Sometimes no sharpening is enough sharpening.

Take JPEGs for a start. When your camera makes JPEGs it attempts to get everything right – brightness, contrast, colour, saturation and sharpness. The thinking is to give casual shooters a photo that needs no more attention. Incamera JPEG sharpening is plenty for on-screen viewing. If you print, either you or the print shop will add sharpening if it seems necessary.

If you shoot RAW, then sharpening is your responsibility. I won't get into sharpening methods since every editing program is slightly different. And anyway, method is not important. Only the results are. Generally, though, sharpening is applied twice - <u>input</u> sharpening in your RAW converter and <u>output</u> sharpening before you print.

RAW converters sharpen to overcome softness intrinsic to digital sensors. This is called input or pre-sharpening. If you are doing further processing outside your RAW editor, then use input sharpening sparingly or not at all. You want to keep your options open as long as possible. For example, if you make multiple final image sizes and/or resolutions, each one is sharpened differently. Sharpening is also different for glossy or matte prints. Perform your final output sharpening after completing all edits including de-noise and resize to final dimensions.

If you make your own prints, you must perform your own output sharpening to suit your paper and viewing distance. You will find extra sharpening is generally necessary for matte paper. If you use a print service you have a choice. Print services expect to sharpen and they are good at this. You can let them sharpen or, if you are confident, do your own sharpening and instruct your print service to "print without adjustments". Otherwise you might get double sharpening.

Lastly, how much sharpening is enough? If you are shooting portraits, sharpen sparingly or not at all. Often you will only sharpen the eyes. You might even want to "un-sharpen" or soften most of the photo. For architecture, glass, metal and similar "man-made" or hard edged subjects, heavy sharpening is appropriate. Flora, fauna and landscapes will land somewhere in the middle.

# **Bylaws Report** by Stan Hingston

The new position of Bylaws Coordinator was created with amendment #9 at the 2021 AGM. Ironically we missed electing someone to that position. As I have been acting as the bylaws coordinator for some years now, keeping the Bylaws and Handbook updated as changes are made, I will carry on until officially appointed, probably at the Fall Board meeting. Of course if someone else wants the job they're welcome to it.

The revised Bylaws incorporating the changes from the amendments passed at the AGM will soon be posted to the website.

The Handbook was been revised to include the new Artistic Expressions competition. It will be up shortly on the website.

If you prefer a paper copy of either document you can easily download them from the website and print them yourself.

I have already started a list of a few more changes to the bylaws that may require amendments at next year's AGM. What can I say—it's a work in progress!

# PRPA Annual General Meeting June 16, 2021

The 2021 Annual General Meeting was held via Zoom teleconference on Wednesday evening, June 16 attended by 23 members.

Dan opened the meeting at 7:02 pm CDT. The agenda was adopted as presented.

The minutes were adopted as amended.

## **Treasurer's Report**

Laird reported a bank balance of \$9,119.36 as of March 30. The Treasurer's report was adopted. A financial review was not presented.

## Correspondence

There was no correspondence. Lois sent a sympathy card to Irene Stinson on her brother's passing.

## Reports

The reports were emailed to everyone with the agenda prior to the meeting so will not be reviewed here. Marlene added that she is still waiting for the results of two competitions. Stan said the Summer Prairie Focus will go out at the end of June. The reports were all adopted as presented.

## **Old Business**

There was no business arising from the reports.

## **New Business**

The proposed new competition, *Gail Christen*sen Artistic Expressions Digital Competition, was approved. This competition is open to all members of PRPA member clubs as well as individual PRPA members (similar to the Hand of Man competition).

Considerable time was taken by discussion and voting on 10 bylaw amendments. These were also distributed with the agenda for this meeting.

All were passed with the exception of Amendment 3 which after some discussion was withdrawn leaving the Fiscal Year End at April 30.

Amendment 10 generated the most discussion. It proposed changing the requirement for Club Reps to be Individual Members of PRPA from "shall be" to "strongly encouraged". It was passed with two members opposed.

## **Election of Officers and Coordinators**

The last item on the agenda was Nominations which was handled by Past Chair Ann Dies.

The three-year terms for Chair and Vice Chair, held by Dan Sigouin and Diane McKinnon were opened for nominations. A few nominations were made but none accepted by the nominated member. Dan agreed to remain in the Chair position until a replacement can be appointed by the Board. The position of Vice Chair will remain vacant until a replacement is appointed. Members were encouraged to step forward to fill these two positions. Contact any Board member to volunteer or to recommend a member for these positions.

Laird had let his name stand for Treasurer. Theresa Busse from Image West Photographic Association was also nominated. A vote was held and Theresa declared the new Treasurer.

David Ingoe had resigned as Member-at-Large. Laird Wilson was nominated for this position.

The members filling all other positions were willing to let their name stand. A motion was passed accepting the Officers and Board members.

Curtiss adjourned the meeting.

Shortly after the meeting a few oversights were noticed by different members of the Board.

The most serious was omitting the motion to waive an Audit and to appoint Reviewers for the 2021-22 fiscal year. A Special General Meeting will need to be called, by September at the latest, to deal with this. Members will be given 30 days notice of this meeting by mail or email.

It was also observed that the Reviewers' report for 2020-21 was not included with the Treasurer's Report. Hopefully this can be completed in time for the Special General Meeting.

A minor oversight was the election or appointment of the Bylaws Coordinator, a new board position created by bylaw amendment #9. This can be done at the Fall Board meeting.

### YouTube Editing Workshop Offer-with Darlene Hildebrandt

Hello, my name is Darlene and I'm a photography teacher and workshop leader with <u>Digital Photo Mentor</u>. I want to invite PRPA club members to participate in a private LIVE session with tips and tutorials about photo editing on my <u>YouTube channel</u>. Each week I edit images submitted by novice photographers and demonstrate how I would approach editing them using Lightroom, Photoshop, and Luminar AI in my workflow.

### What you get:

I have set aside Wed July 7 starting at 6:00 pm MDT for your group and will edit only your member's images on that date. You can then join me live at that time and ask questions in the chat as we go. So it will be like a private lesson for your group, but the best thing is that there is no charge to your club or members. The video recording will stay on my YouTube channel forever so you can watch it again and again. Note it will be public for all to view.

### How to participate:

All you have to do is submit one or two of your images. I need a minimum of 10 images to make it work. Just fill in <u>this form</u> and upload your images here.

### What kind of images to submit:

I'm looking for images that are already good photos, but need some love and enhancement to make them shine. Send images that meet these criteria:

- RAW files (preferred) or the original camera JPG
- Images which are fairly well-exposed and in focus. I

can fix minor exposure issues and sharpness but I can't perform miracles

- Images that lack punch or color are great
- Images that you want to try converting to b/w
- Portrait images that need facial retouching or editing
- Images with a boring or blown out sky

• Portraits that need a head swap (one person's eyes are closed, poor expression) but they MUST be shot at the same session, same lighting, same cropping and composition. In other words, two virtually identical groups, just different frames and expressions.

• Images needing something removed or cloned out.

• Images that have distracting elements or the subject isn't standing out.

### What I cannot use:

- Small JPGs
- Already edited images
- Out of focus images
- Images that are 3 stops under or overexposed
- Images with poor lighting
- Images that have no clear subject

**NOTE:** I cannot promise to edit every image submitted. I will choose the ones that I feel will provide the best demonstration and learning points.
