I have to compile a slideshow of the winning photos as well as print off the certificates for the Outing Awards Banquet on June 11. As it is my first year of doing this it might be a bit of a challenge with it being unfamiliar territory for me. Thanks in advance for your promptness.





A message from the National President, Lloyd C Kitchen.

The Association for Photographic Art is a reality. After months of planning, correspondence, meetings, screening of ideas and above all approaching all of the problems with determined attitudes to find the solutions, but always within the framework of true democracy, the founders are now emerging with the gratification of accomplishment.

In the very near future we will be in a position to supply members and member clubs for slides, General and Nature. Evaluation services will be available for slides and prints as well as judging services. General club assistance will be available and also program planning and publications and many others that have been needed by photographers across Canada.

In perusing the names of our officers and chairmen, one will recognize many of today's leaders in photography and of the representation clear across Canada. The Constitution

At the January 27, 1968 meeting, a committee was formed and charged with the responsibility for drawing up a workable constitution for the Prairie Region of Photographic Arts. The impression was left with the Committee that a strong and formal organization was desired due to the lack of a National Photographic Organization for support and direction.

After a series of meetings in Red Deer, Edmonton and Calgary, a formal constitution suitable for an organization desiring provincial incorporation was developed and approved by the Committee.

However, during the time that the regional constitution was being prepared it became apparent that a National Photographic Association would be operating by the summer 1968 and that a strong regional organization would not be conducive to the success of that organization. Accordingly it was decided that the constitution should be simplified so that the region could support the National Association rather than competing with it. This revised

constitution was prepared providing a workable base for operation on a simplified scale.

It is our earnest intention and hope that the region will support and promote the national activities within the regional structure. The constitution will enable us to achieve this and be viable enough to include all regional activities. Perhaps in time it will need to be revised to allow the Prairie Region of Photographic Arts to become an actual part of the National Association.

The Constitution is printed in total, articles from 1 to 4.

Mr. Spiteri gives a half page report on the proper use of a dark room and how to dilute the different solutions with the different films that are used.

<u>Coming Events, and Exhibitions</u> were listed for those who wished to participate.

A request for a club to host the 1968-69 Annual Outing and General Meeting. The 1968 Outing is to be held in Claresholm on June 22/23, 1968.

<u>National News, Some thoughts on the new organization</u> by Robert N Smith, APSA, EFIAP.

Smith voiced his thoughts about taking pictures all year instead of once in a while to keep your techniques familiar. To accept criticism on your pictures and gain from it. To take advantage of the services offered in your Club, Regional or National organizations. To join in the activities. Don't complain about things you don't like unless you are prepared to offer help to correct the situation. To remember that all the services are voluntary and that many hands make light work! That you are just as responsible to help operate our group as the next person is, and everyone has some skill or talent that suits him/her to a useful task.

He closed by saying in short, be enthusiastic, helpful and eager to learn new ways of seeing and understanding, and you will be helping to build a first-rate organization. Such an organization can't be created out of thin air, but must depend on the membership alone to reach a high standard.

The Travelling Salon Competition for the season 1967-68 was ably handled by Mr. Frank Ede of the Waskasoo Club of Red Deer. Frank reported that 11 entries were submitted for judging, about the same as last year.

Members listed as entrants were: Sylvia Hayhoe of Waskasso Club, winner with Jon Clasessen, Phil Porcher, Tom Webb and W. A. Lea of the Edmonton Club, Luverne Reishus and Steve Klatzel of the Calgary Club, and John Lotochinsky and Richard Bell of the Saskatoon Camera Club.

Membership Trophy Competition 1967-68.

This is one trophy that I am ashamed to present, mainly because a good many of our Clubs showed decreases. This was due probably to the upheaval of CPAC and the reorganization of the Region to take in all types of photography. People did not want to commit themselves until they saw what was happening. I am expecting a great increase in membership next fall with new members, new clubs and a new outlook on photography across the Prairies.

The Clubs listed were Saskatoon, Turner Valley, Sexsmith, Claresholm, High River, Bow Valley, Foothills Calgary, Gateway Edmonton, Waskasoo Red Deer, Red Deer Camera Club, Medicine Hat, Innisfail and Lacombe.

The Russell and Everest Trophies were awarded to the Bow Valley Club. The Travelling Salon was awarded to the Waskasoo Club. The Membership Trophy was awarded to the Chinook Camera Club. The topic for the Russell Trophy Competition for 1968-69 is Off and On.


We then ride on to Batoche National Historic Site where we will journey back in time to the life of 19th century Metis settlers on the banks of the South Saskatchewan River.
