






Wheel the World



The De-Mystifying Filter by Keith Putt #6 – **Tips on Inkjet Printing**

First, don't skimp on media. Better paper gives better colour saturation and deeper blacks. *Trust me on this*. Don't waste expensive ink on inferior paper.

Start with paper from the printer manufacturer – Canon paper on Canon printers, Epson paper on Epson printers. If you experience problems, you at least know it isn't a printer/paper/ink mismatch. Know what you are doing before trying other brands.

Paper comes in roughly 3 categories:

Photo paper is the plastic-ish stuff. Usual surfaces are gloss, semi-gloss and lustre/pearl (pebbly). Photo papers give highest saturation, blackest blacks and best resistance to handling damage.

Matte paper runs from glorified office paper up to respectable photo paper. Thickness is about .005" to .010" and surface is smooth. Stock colour varies from white to creamy. Because matte papers are on the thin side, heavy inking can cause buckling.

Fine-art papers are available in satin-ish sheens but rarely full gloss. Most are matte. Texture varies from ultra-smooth to very bumpy. Thickness is about .012" to over .020". These are stiff, stable papers. Most fine-art paper stock is creamy (warm tone) but a few are fairly white. There are many gorgeous fine-art papers.

Most matte and fine-art papers are susceptible to handling damage. Also, the ink receptive coating is brittle. If you mount (on foam core for example) and trim to the coloured edge, chipping along the edges can be an issue.

No professional photographer in their right mind lets their printer control colour. Neither should you. For best and consistent results, control colour from colour managed workspaces such as Photoshop or Lightroom. Consider dedicated print management software such as Canon Print Studio and Epson Print Layout. Both are free. I use and recommend Qimage Ultimate (PC) or Qimage One (Mac).

Turn off Printer Manages Colour in your printer driver and turn on colour management in

your management software. Then manually select your paper's ICC profile and other settings in your management software.

Two setting are Rendering Intent and Black Point Compensation. The important renderings for colour printing are Relative Colorimetric and Perceptual. There is no correct rendering intent. Try them both. Perceptual works best with my photographic style and printer. Turn Black Point Compensation on.

Printer drivers have quality settings such as good, better, best. Each step up lays more ink dots, uses more ink and runs slower. Highest quality supposedly gives smoothest graduations and perhaps sharper edges and deeper colour. You need to run your own experiments. On my printer, it is almost impossible to discern a difference between the 2 highest quality settings.

Printing neutral B&W is tricky. If your printer driver has a special B&W mode, I recommend it for most B&W. This is the only time I recommend letting the printer manage colour. Epson's term is Advanced B&W (ABW) mode. Canon calls it B&W mode. These special modes give the most neutral B&W prints. **Turn on** ABW or B&W mode in your printer driver and **turn off** colour management in your management software.

PRPA Board Meeting November 28, 2020

The Fall board meeting was held via Zoom teleconference on Saturday afternoon, November 28. Attending were: Dan Sigouin, Diane McKinnon, Ann Dies, Lois Howes, Laird Wilson, Marlene Andrew, Maureen Sinclair, Keith Putt, Stan Hingston, Curtiss Lund, Brenda Winny, Larry Easton, and Colleen Edwards.

Dan opened the meeting at 2:03 pm CST.

The minutes were adopted as amended.

Laird reported a bank balance of \$9,503.97 as of October 31. We are not yet set up to accept etransfer membership fee payments.

Written reports were circulated prior to the meeting and were not read in the meeting.

- Dan in his Chair Report expressed encouragement and gratitude during the pandemic. "I want to send out my sincere thanks to everyone involved with the camera clubs and PRPA executive. Everyone is doing the best they can in challenging circumstances. We will get through this."
- In Lois' Secretary report she mentioned feeling overwhelmed with her new role but managed to get the agenda and reports gathered and sent out on time two weeks before the meeting. She also wrote and mailed three sympathy cards to members. She asked all of us to inform her of any recent bereavements in the families of PRPA members.
- Laird reported 69 individual and 9 club memberships are paid to date.
- Marlene reported that all of the prints from the spring competitions have been returned. She thanked the judging clubs and the club reps for making her job easier.
- In Maureen's Print Circuit report she said that due to some members retiring she will be reducing the number of circuits from four to three starting in January.
- Keith reported that there is one full circuit of both critique and editing circuits with 6 and 5 members respectively.
- Stan reported that there are 25 members who request a paper copy of the Prairie Focus newsletter. He calculated the cost of printing

and mailing to be \$22 per member per year.

• There were no reports from the Webmaster, Archivist or the two Members at Large.

All reports were adopted as read or amended.

Under new business several motions were made affecting the competitions and Handbook.

- The rule about allowing an image to be entered a second time providing it did not place (1st, 2nd, 3rd or HM) was changed to allow an image to be entered an unlimited number of times providing it did not place.
- A rule was added to the Single Song slideshow competition that the maker's name is not to appear in the slideshow credits.
- A motion was passed to allow the Competition Coordinator to make minor changes to the competition rules and Handbook without Board approval.

Maureen led a discussion about contacting members regarding membership renewal. It was decided that a reminder notice would go out with the Summer newsletter and another by email on September 1.

A motion was made to increase the membership fee by \$20 for those members who opt for a paper copy of the newsletter to offset the cost of printing and mailing. After much discussion the motion was defeated.

A motion was passed that printed copies of the Bylaws and Handbook would be automatically provided to new members and new clubs, and to others only on request. A motion to cease mailing out receipts and member cards was withdrawn after some discussion.

The following motions affect the Bylaws so will need to be brought up again at the AGM. To be brought to the AGM, bylaw amendments must first be passed at a board meeting.

- A motion to extend the membership grace period to November 15 was defeated; it will remain at October 31.
- The fiscal year end was changed from April 30 to June 30.

Board Meeting report cont'd

- The membership year end was changed from July 31 to June 30.
- The head office address of PRPA was changed to 314 Main Street, Box 1120, Rosetown SK. This is the address of Jim Turner's law office; Jim is a PRPA member from Rosetown who registered PRPA with the Saskatchewan government.
- A motion to make the financial review optional (to be decided at each AGM) was defeated; it will remain mandatory.
- Bylaw 4.3 was reworded slightly to read in part "... A list of candidates shall be included in the agenda circulated prior to the AGM. Nominations may also be accepted from the floor."
- Bylaw 3.9 was amended and Bylaw 7.2 added to clarify that Club Representatives, although they are not officially Directors, may attend, speak, make and second motions, and vote at any meeting of the PRPA Board.
- To accommodate teleconference meetings for the Board and Membership (AGM) meetings, amendments were passed for Bylaws 7.6, 7.8, 8.1, and 8.6.
- Bylaw 10.1 was amended to accommodate notice of meetings by email.
- Bylaws 6.5 and 6.6 were added to add the positions of Digital Circuits Coordinator and Bylaws Coordinator. Bylaw 6.1 was amended to include these positions.

These bylaw changes, and any others passed at the March board meeting, do not take effect until passed at the AGM. The exact wording of the changes will be sent to members prior to the AGM for your consideration.

Laird knows of a printer in Regina that will print, staple and mail the newsletter for a lower cost. It was decided to try them for this issue.

The purchase of a PA system for PRPA meetings was discussed but, because it requires a major expenditure, will be brought up at the AGM.

Laird adjourned the meeting at 5:00 pm (Curtiss who usually adjourns the meetings had to leave the meeting early).

PRPA Webinars

At the November board meeting a suggestion was made that, since we will not be holding an Outing again this year, PRPA should consider sponsoring some webinars for our members. These would be on photographic topics of interest to most and would be free to full members.

Dan and Stan contacted a few webinar providers, including Darlene Hildebrandt (who has been advertising in this newsletter for a few years), and PRPA member David Bellerive.

This is the schedule so far. The first two are by **Darlene Hildebrandt** of Digital Photo Mentor and will start at 7:00 pm (AB) / 8:00 (SK/MB). Note Darlene has not yet confirmed the dates.



- ◆ Tuesday February 23 Image Review - 10 criteria for how to analyze images—your own and others
- Thursday March 25 Manual HDR how to shoot in manual mode and process in Aurora HDR and Lightroom.



We will also have **Matt Klos-kowski** who will share some of the tips from his new online course "Inside the Composition". We're waiting for his new schedule to come out to choose a date but expect it will be in March or April. Learn more about Matt and his com-

position course at https://mattk.com/ composition. Note Module #2 on horizon placement is free to watch.

Finally we will have **David Bellerive** sharing his tips on pet photography. We have been seeing his amazing dog photography for a few years now in the competitions and circuits (an example of his work is on page 4 of this issue). A date has not been set yet for David's presentation but it will likely be in May or June.

We may run some webinars again in the fall so let us know of speakers you would like to hear or topics you would like to have covered. And if any of you have experience in a particular aspect of photography and would like to share it with us, that would be great.

Rosetown Photography Club Report by Stan Hingston

The Rosetown Photography Club resumed inperson monthly meetings in September 2020, the first since March. We are down to nine members and typically have six to eight show up at a meeting so it's not hard to maintain social distancing (and we wear masks). We meet the first Tuesday of the month from September to May.

The Rosetown club is active in PRPA. Of our nine members, all but two are PRPA members. We enter the Everest and Gerry Fish club competitions each year and usually have a club entry in Showmanship.

The Rosetown Art & Photography Show, which is co-hosted by the Rosetown Arts Council and the Photography Club, was cancelled for 2020 and 2021.

We still show photo exhibits in the Hallway Gallery downtown (the mini-mall where Stan's store is located), changed every two months. The hallway got a new paint job this fall and is now a nice light cream color—a big improvement over the previous green! We have also been hanging the exhibits in the Rosetown Hospital until they asked us to take it down due to Covid cleaning regulations. Hopefully this will change soon as the patients, visitors and staff really appreciated having the photos to look at.

We have two exhibits in the gallery: Club Theme and Member's Showcase. We choose themes a year ahead and each member is asked to contribute one or two prints on the theme. The current theme is "Rosetown Harvest Festival 2010-2019". Since the Harvest Festival was cancelled for 2020 and likely will be for 2021 we thought it would be nice to show scenes from past years' parade and other activities. Other themes this year are "Texture", "To Be Young Again" and "Lazy Days of Summer".

In the Member Showcase each member gets a turn to put up an exhibit of their work. The current exhibit is by member Carrie Olivier Brown with black and white images from a May 2019 trip to Italy and Switzerland with her daughter.

The club provides mats and frames (11x14 and 16x20) so all the members need to provide are the prints. Each exhibit has room for 12-15 photos. A press release to our local weekly newspaper the "Rosetown Eagle" about the current exhibits netted a nice article with a photo on page 2.

We have had no outside speaker at a meeting since October 2019 when Tim Yaworski of Saskatoon gave us a presentation on star photography (inspiring Stan to buy a Star Tracker, but that's another story). And the last time we went on a group field trip was September 2018. Hopefully we'll get this virus under control and we can resume normal activities soon!

Christopher Dean 1930-2020

Christopher Dean was born in Middlesbrough England on March 13th, 1930 and passed away peacefully in the early morning of November 6th, 2020.

His greatest joy was his family. Left to grieve are his wife Jeanette, his three children Christopher, Andrew (Cathy) and Kathy and much loved grandchildren and great grandchildren, together with his brother Allan and his sister Irene in England.

He gained his PhD on the phonology of Yorkshire Dia-

lects at the University of Leeds where he met Jeanette, a fellow student. They were married there in 1953 and he had his first University position at the University of Malaya.

The family immigrated to Canada in 1959 where he taught at Queens University and the University of Western Ontario. He eventually stopped moving westwards and taught at the University of Saskatchewan for thirty-two years. He gave numerous papers on phonology, Old English and Medieval Literature all over the world. Late in his career he specialized in Arthurian Studies, becoming the Canadian authority in the field, giving papers in Europe, and writing books on Arthur, Merlin and Guinevere.

He loved teaching and particularly enjoyed working with senior classes for ten years after his retirement. Chris was a man of many parts. He and Jeanette together enjoyed life to the fullest and giving back to the community. He was a lay reader in the Anglican Church and treasurer for several churches, clubs and UNICEF Saskatchewan. He ran Gateway Box Office and did the program for several years.

Chris loved to travel and he was a gifted and meticulous photographer. The travel shows he made, together with exhibitions, were shared with many groups and libraries in Saskatoon. Singing, woodwork, renovating, chess and bridge all had a part in his life.

He played cricket, as wicket keeper and opening bat for the R.A.F. In England and the



R.M.C. in Kingston, and was an avid soccer watcher who loyally supported his little hometown team.
